Academic Support Center (ASC) -Testing Facility

- A newly created space fully accessible to students of all skill levels and learning styles.
- Whether a student needs additional support or a small group is working at an accelerated pace, the ASC is staffed to accommodate student needs.

On the testing side, students have:

- Work spaces and varying test-taking environments with new wall-mounted touch screen computers at varying heights.
- Noise canceling headphones to ensure the optimal testing environment.
- A wide variety of flexible seating options, such as standing desks, floor chairs, and agespecific working stations.








Academic Support Center (ASC) -STREAM Resource Center

- A defined space that extends learning beyond the classroom with STEM kits, alphabet and number games, spelling and math manipulatives, fractions kits, and more!
- 3 new mobile STREAM carts, 4 early-finisher carts, and 1 sensory cart tailored to K-2, 3-5, and 6-8 will be deployed into the classrooms.
- The calming corner centers on personal mindfulness and helps children to manage stress, self-regulate, and control impulses. This will support their processing abilities, increase their confidence, and allow for a focus back on cognition and learning.
 - Students will find:
 - Calming cubes, calming stones, calming twists, tactile mazes, timers and fidgets
 - Breathing cards and techniques
 - An oversized coloring mural




Sensory Pathways

The Installation of Interior & Exterior Sensory Pathway Experiences for all ages groups

- An animal-themed sensory pathway will be installed over the new flooring in the Kindergarten Hallway.
- An agility and fitness-themed sensory experience will be installed outside for use during recess, gym, and at teacher discretion.

What is a Sensory Pathway?

- Sensory Pathways use specific movements, visual cues, and muscle stretches to teach coping mechanisms for students of all ages.
 - Pathways transform hallways into places of purpose and offer students a place to redirect outside of the classroom.
 - They are colorful yet calming spaces that allow children to recapture control of their emotional and academic well-being by reducing tension, redirecting energy, and re-engaging one's focus.







Differentiated Reading Program & Increased Math Resources

To focus on assessing and accelerating learning at the individual student level, the model of differentiation in the mathematics curriculum will expand to tailored enrichment offerings in Language Arts and Reading as well.

- Differentiated Literacy Kits and Differentiated Math Kits for grades K-5 streamline the planning for centers rotations by offering set topics while also incorporating hands-on activities designed to reach all students.
- Students practice the same objective which has 3-skill-level options (approaching, meeting, and beyond) to differentiate or scaffold student's skills.
- Every activity includes teacher directives, activity cards, and hands-on manipulatives.








COMING SOON: Collaborative Desks

- Having layout choices helps teachers accommodate various learning styles.




Teacher Tuition Assistance & Acknowledgement

Renewed access to Nearpod enables teachers to:

- Create online quizzes and assessments.
- Create polls to assess student understanding.
- Incorporate videos and multimedia curriculum.
- Take students on "virtual field trips."
- Allow students to record answers directly into a lesson.
- Synchronize with students to stay focused in independent self-paced modules.

New access to Flocabulary, a literacy extension within Nearpod

 Flocabulary is an extension of Nearpod in which hip-hop videos and instructional activities promote literacy and spark creativity.



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School Facilities & Security Improvements

In addition to new carpeting in the main entry and hallway, Luxury Vinyl Tile (LVT) is installed as the first phase of a flooring replacement project in the:

- The Front Office / Administrative Offices
- Kindergarten Hallway
- Faculty Lounge
- LVT is easy to clean, reduces noise, offers a variety of design layouts to distinguish different areas, and is built to last.
- The goal is additional phases to update the remaining hallways and classroom spaces.





Renewal of Lobby Guard

- LobbyGuard is a comprehensive visitor management and front office automation system designed to increase building and facility security and awareness through a process of tracking, screening, and badging visitor traffic.
