

- > Rest and Digest/Brain Break


✓ Language Arts:


- ✓ Daily phonics practice
- ✓ Letter recognition & letter sounds
- ✓ Develop reading skills
- Handwriting and journal writing
- ✓ Sight word recognition
- ✓ Role playing
- Rhyming and poetry
- ✓ Word Study



✓ Reading Program:

- ✓ We read in whole groups, in small groups, and individually.
- Reading every day is essential!
- We will be sending home a book once a week to be read by your child to you. You will write comments to help the teacher in a parent log.
- Our homework reader is meant to reinforce the vocabulary words and phonics worked on in class. Please supplement this with books of your child's interest.
- Encourage your child to point to each word as he/she reads.
- Encourage your child to use the picture clues to help him/her figure out the words.
- Provide your child with a daily model by seeing you read.
- Word Study is a developmental method of teaching phonics and spelling.
- Word sorts will be related to the weekly phonics concepts and will be used in class and practiced at home.





✓ Math:

- ✓ Patterning, sorting, grouping and comparing sets of objects - more, fewer and equal
- ✓ Manipulatives will be used to reinforce a solid understanding of numerals to 100
- ✓ Addition & subtraction facts to 10
- Learning to tell time to the hour and to identify money
- ✓ Learning to count by 2's, 5's, & 10's to 100
- ✓ Basic understanding of fractions and geometry
- ✓ Introduction to measurement
- ✓ Math journal writing





✓ Religion:



- ✓ Our goal is to establish a friendship with Jesus.
- ✓ We will learn prayers: Our Father, Hail Mary, Guardian Angel, Glory Be, Live Jesus Live, Mother of Good Counsel, and the Prayer Before Meals.
- ✓ We read from both the Old and New Testaments
 of the children's bible.
- ✓ We will learn to be mindful of Jesus' presence in our hearts.
- ✓ We will learn that saints are our special friends.
 Each classroom has its own patron saint.



- Homework will be given Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.
- On Mondays, we will be sending home a book for independent reading at home.
- On Tuesday Thursday, we will send home phonics, math, handwriting and reading comprehension homework - one page per night.
- ✓ It is your child's responsibility to complete the homework.
- ✓ Please review your child's homework daily.
- Remind your child to place his/her homework in the Red Folder and return it to school each day this will help establish a lifetime of good school habits.
- ✓ Homework is meant to teach responsibility as well as reinforce what we do in school.

Social Skills

- Learning through play is an important part of our day.
- ✓ Time is given each day for your child to interact in an unstructured environment.
- Learning to share, take turns, use kind words, follow the rules, and to be considerate are our goals.
- Please practice social skills with your child by, helping them to use appropriate language, and to take turns during supervised play dates.

Attitude is Everything

- Sell it! Start now with speaking often about how great Kindergarten is going to be!
 - Listen to concerns, but stay positive

Separation Anxiety


- Is normal and varies with every child (& parent!)
- Practice makes perfect sitters/play dates
- Speak of "your new school" often



Encourage "Big girl/boy" Activities and Behaviors

Daily chores

- Make bed
- Dress themselves
- Practice tying their shoes
- Make their own lunch
- Help empty dishwasher
- Help mom/dad in the yard



Clean up after themselves

- After meals, toys, activities and clothes
- Do nothing for your child that they can do for themselves

Rules to Live By

Firm limits at home means easier acceptance of rules at school

- Encourage sharing, taking turns, and being patient
- Practice not interrupting adults
- Words instead of hitting, tears, and tantrums
- "Our hands are God's hands and God's hands are helping hands,
 not hurting hands." (Dr. Margaret Adams)
- Tantrums are for 2 year olds! Zero tolerance at home helps reinforce it at school.
- "Vitamin N" goes a long way!" (John Rosemond, PhD)
- Practice saying "no" to your child and helping them accept that "no means no!"
 - This helps teach patience and tolerance
 - Limits tantrums

Suggestions for Helping Your Child Prepare for Kindergarten

- ✓ Your child should be comfortable speaking and responding to adults.
- ✓ Be able to handle a backpack, lunchbox, sweater, and jacket.
- Read with your child everyday!
- Be able to use a belt and tucking in their shirts.
- ✓ Be able to say their full name and address, and be in the process of memorizing their telephone number.
- ✓ Be able to hold and use pencils, crayons, markers, and scissors, successfully. They should be able to manage these items in a responsible way.
- Be able to write their first name from left to right.
- ✓ Be able to recite and recognize the alphabet and numbers from 1-10.
- Be able to listen to simple directions and respond appropriately.
- Be able to interact positively in a group by using good manners and kind words.
- ✓ Be able to attend Mass with appropriate behavior, know simple prayers, and use the Sign of the Cross.
- ✓ Learn to be independent in the bathroom, washing hands, blowing their nose, and using tissues appropriately.

Things to Bring to School

- ✓ A backpack without wheels
- One healthy snack and a lunch every day
- ✓ Please label <u>all</u> of your child's items and clothing with his/her <u>first and last name!</u>
- ✓ You will pay a flat supply fee and all supplies will be distributed at school.
