## Vocabulary

climate - average weather of a place over many years

temperate - moderate in terms of temperature

migration - movement of people from one place to another

metropolitan area - urban areas which are geographically close to each other

population density - measure of the number of people per unit of land

market economy - economy in which individual consumers and producers make all economic decisions

export - good or service produce within a country and sold outside the country's borders

import - good or service sold within a country that is produced in another country

economic region - place where people do particular kinds of work

diplomacy - managing communication and relationships between countries

precipitation -water that falls to the ground as rain, snow, sleet, or hail

tundra - area with limited vegetation, such as moss and shrubs

permafrost - permanently frozen soil

mixing zone - an area where warm and cool water combine and stir nutrients from the ocean floor; fish feed on these nutrients

cultural mosaic - place where people from different areas retain their cultural identity constitutional monarchy - system of government in which the laws in the constitution limit the monarch's or emperor's powers

plural society - society in which distinctive cultural, ethnic, and racial groups are encouraged to maintain their own identities and cultures
